

## Grade 2 Identifying Proper Nouns Lesson Plan

Lesson Title:	Identifying Proper Nouns		
Grade Level(s):	Grade 2	Lesson Duration:	30 Minutes
<b>Lesson Objectives</b>			
After completing the lesson the students will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• identify and write proper nouns from a set of words, enhancing their understanding of noun types and capitalization rules.</li></ul>			
<b>Lesson Description</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Introduce the concept of nouns, explaining that they are words that name people, places, things, or ideas.</li><li>• Explain the difference between common nouns and proper nouns, giving examples (e.g., common nouns: "dog," "city," "car"; proper nouns: "Buddy," "Chicago," "Ford").</li><li>• Write a few examples of proper nouns on the board and discuss why they are proper nouns (capitalize names of specific people, places, and things).</li><li>• Explain that students will be given sets of words on their worksheet and will need to identify and write the proper nouns from each set. Distribute the worksheets.</li><li>• Model how to identify and write the proper nouns from the first set of words on the worksheet with the class.</li><li>• Instruct students to look at each set of words on their own and write the proper nouns in the spaces provided. Allow students to work independently on their worksheets. Circulate to provide assistance and encouragement.</li><li>• Review the completed worksheets as a class, discussing the correct answers and reinforcing the concept of proper nouns. Provide additional examples, if needed.</li></ul>			
<b>Materials/Equipment</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <a href="#">Identifying proper nouns worksheet</a></li><li>• Pencils</li><li>• Chart paper and markers</li><li>• Examples of common and proper nouns</li></ul>			
<b>Assignment</b>			
Ask students to find five proper nouns at home (e.g., names of family members, pets, places) and write them down. Bring their list to the next class.
