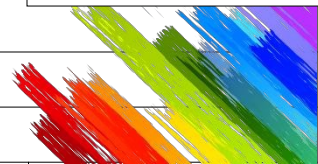


Lesson Plan: A Colorful Adventure! (Learning Colors in Kindergarten)

Lesson Title:	Naming and recognizing colors		
Grade Level(s):	Kindergarten	Lesson Duration:	45 Minutes



Lesson Objectives

After completing the lesson:

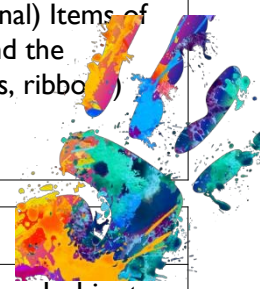
- Students will be able to identify and name six basic colors: red, yellow, blue, green, orange, and purple.
- Students will be able to sort objects by color.
- Students will be able to participate in a color-themed song or activity.

Summary of Tasks/Actions

1. **Warm-up:** Begin by singing a color song together. There are many catchy children's songs about colors available online or in children's songbooks.
2. **Color Exploration:** Uncurl each large piece of construction paper and display them on the board or around the room. Tell the students the name of each color and have them repeat it after you.
3. **Sorting Colors:** Distribute the pictures or cut-outs of familiar objects among the students. Instruct them to walk around the room and place each picture under the corresponding colored construction paper based on the object's color.
4. **Color Identification:** As students sort, have them say the color of the object and the color of the construction paper they are placing it under. You can also call out a color and have students race to find an object of that color and bring it to you.
5. **Color Scavenger Hunt (Optional):** If time allows, hide a few colored items from around the classroom (blocks, crayons, ribbons etc.) Have students search for the items and identify their colors when they find them.

Materials/Equipment

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large construction paper or chart paper in six different colors (red, yellow, blue, green, orange, purple) • Pictures or cut-outs of familiar objects in various colors (e.g., apple, sun, sky, grass, pumpkin, grapes) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Crayons or markers(Optional) Items of different colors from around the classroom (e.g., blocks, toys, ribbon) |
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Take Home Tasks

- Play a color matching game where students have to find pairs of the same colored objects.
- Read a children's book that features a variety of colors.
- Have students create their own color collage using construction paper scraps or magazines.
