Using Dialogue to Develop Characters and Events

In narrative writing, dialogue is used not only to show what characters say but also to **reveal their personalities**, **relationships**, and **move the plot forward**. When characters speak, their words, tone, and the way they interact can help the reader understand what kind of person they are and what's happening in the story.

Examples:

Example 1 – Dialogue reveals character personality:

"I don't care what they think," Lily said, arms crossed. "I'm doing it my way."

→ Lily is confident and independent.

Example 2 – Dialogue moves the plot forward:

"The bridge is out!" shouted Mark. "We'll have to find another way across!"

→ This creates urgency and moves the characters toward a new decision.

Example 3 – Dialogue shows relationships:

"Don't worry, I've got your back," said Jake.

"I know," replied Maya. "You always do."

→ This reveals a close, trusting friendship.
